## Crimp Hill Cemetery Regulations

Old Windsor Parish Council is committed to maintaining this lawn cemetery to a very high standard as a fitting resting place for the deceased and as an area of peace and tranquillity for all visitors.

In addition to the statutory rules affecting cemeteries, the following rules apply;

Seven to Ten days after an interment, the floral tributes sent to the funeral that are no longer required will be removed. After this date any plants or pots placed on the grassed area of the plot will be removed.

Over a period of time the ground will settle and the grave will be topped up with soil until it is appropriate to turf over or reseed which will be done by the Parish Council Contractors.

No memorial shall be erected or altered without the approval of the Parish Council and that permission will only be granted for a single headstone with or without an integral vase or an approved flower holder.

In the sections of the cemetery where the headstone support beam is provided, planted containers may be placed on either side of the headstone but these must not be placed on the grassed area nor may they be so large that they encroach on neighbouring plots. Planting on the grassed area is strictly forbidden.

The grassed area throughout the cemetery must be kept free of memorials or other tributes.

The boundary of the grave plot must not be defined with fencing, edging stones or planting.

Glass or easily breakable containers must not be used. Artificial flowers are acceptable but any other forms of memorabilia are not allowed.

Anything placed on a grave space that does not meet these regulations will be removed.

The scattering of ashes is not allowed at any time.

These simple rules are in place to ensure that the Parish Council can, with reasonable economy, maintain the cemetery in a fitting condition. The purchase of a plot at Crimp Hill Cemetery implies full acceptance of these conditions and the Parish Council respectfully requests that plot owners abide by them.
